The Pupil premium is allocated for the educational benefit of the children at school. The Pupil premium is additional to main school funding and is allocated to address inequality and disadvantage.

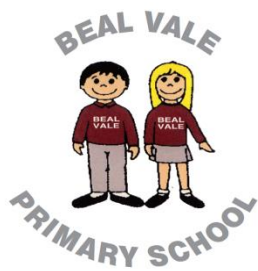
Funds are allocated across the financial year not the academic year.

Measuring the Impact of Pupil Premium Funding

The positive impact of pupil premium spending is also shown by the reduction in the gap between pupil premium pupils at Beal Vale and other pupils nationally.
