Good attendance and punctuality remain a key priority for our school. Classroom doors open at 8:45am and close promptly at 8:55am. Arriving on time ensures that children are ready to start their learning without disruption.

Even small amounts of lateness can have a significant impact over time. For example:

- Being 15 minutes late each day can result in the loss of approximately 10 days of learning over the course of a year.
- Being 30 minutes late each day can result in around 19 days of lost learning.

These lost minutes quickly add up, affecting both progress and confidence. We ask for your continued support in ensuring that children arrive at school on time every day, ready to learn.

Please remember that this weekend is a Bank Holiday weekend. School will be closed on Monday, and we look forward to welcoming all children back on Tuesday 5th May at 8:45am.
